A Famous Warrior Who Hated War

“Every gun that is made, every warship launched, every rocket fired signifies, in the final sense, a theft from those who hunger and are not fed, those who are cold and are not clothed. The world in arms is not spending money alone. It is spending the sweat of laborers, the genius of its scientists, the hopes of its children.... This is not a way of life at all, in any true sense. Under the cloud of threatening war, it is humanity hanging from an iron cross.”

—From a speech by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1953, at the end of the Korean War

TRIP TO TRANSYLVANIA

Would you like to visit Transylvania and see important Unitarian sites and stay in our partner village for a few days? Unity Church in St. Paul is organizing a trip to their partner village, not far from ours, and has offered an opportunity for a few of us to go along. They will be leaving July 24 for Budapest, traveling from Budapest to Kluj-Napoca (Kolosvar) the next day and visiting important Unitarian sites there, then to the villages for several days. Return will be via Deva and other interesting cities, with a pilgrimage up to the citadel where Francis David was martyred. Return to Budapest the night of August 4, with sightseeing the 5th. One could choose to stay in Budapest longer, if desired. It is a beautiful city! The cost will be \$1,700, not including air fare to Budapest or sightseeing there.
