A VIEW FROM THE HILL

Thank you.

We had a full and fruitful candidating week, you and I, culminating in your decision to call me as your minister and my joyful acceptance of your call. Some of you no doubt breathed a sigh of relief after the vote on April 3, thinking, now life at church can get back to normal. Others of you, I know, are asking what's next?

Some of what's next will unfold in a fashion that is very much like getting back to normal. Sunday services (including our turn to give the service in the park for Syttende Mai), clean up Sunday, annual meeting, summer recess. And some of what's next will happen deliberately, with an eye to the future and attention to making the most of our new covenant as congregation and settled minister.

At a special meeting during candidating week the Nora board and I agree on three goals to focus our work for the next 18 months or so. First, to revamp and restart religious education. Second, to review the church by-laws and revise as necessary, with special attention paid to provisions for the endowment fund. And third, to revitalize Nora Church's partner church relationship with the Benced congregation. Initial steps have been taken already on each of these goals. In the coming weeks the board will appoint three task forces and charge them with the responsibility of carrying forward and accomplishing the goals. The task forces will dissolve when their work is finished. The board and I anticipate much of the work of the church shifting away from standing committees toward this goal centered, task force driven approach over the coming years.

At its regular meeting on April 10, the board put together a budget for the 2011-2012 church year, working hard to bring the figures more closely in line with what will actually be needed to meet the church's needs for the coming year--in some instances cutting projected spend-ing and in some instances raising it. The board also discussed several significant changes in the way church finances are handled from a book keeping perspective and also the way some individual funds might be managed to allow them to accrue over the course of more than one fiscal year. These changes will be announced as soon as the details are finalized.

A service of installation - the ceremonial recognition of our new relationship to one another - is planned for Sunday, August 21, 2011, as part of our day long celebration of Nora Church's 130th anniversary. Put it on your calendar now. Guest speakers and dignitaries and neighbors and friends will join us for the joyous occasion.

Soon after the installation we'll be back at work. As is routine with the call of a new minister (even one who has been around for a couple of years), the district will send an experienced minister to work with the board, other leadership, and me for a start-up weekend. At that time we'll clarify roles and expectations and the way forward.

As I said on April 3, at the end of the rainbow lies the gold and the work of spending it. Our work has begun. Labors of love--for one another and for our shared church.
