NORA CHURCH'S WIND TURBINE PERFORMS WELL

Nora church's wind turbine started producing in late April and has been able to take advantage of the windy spring weather. A meter measuring output sets production so far at 254 kilowatt hours. Chad Palmer of Wind Turbine Industries, manufacturer of the Jacobs 21-30 turbine and the inverter, was at Nora Church and answered questions about the turbine and it's operation after pot luck on Sunday May 1. He described our site as being a better site than he imagined. The turbine will need to be serviced in about 6 months and yearly thereafter. Prairie Beacon appreciates the interest that Nora Church members and the community have shown in this project.
