I have had 27 children, babies, and 'temporary teens' in and out of the parsonage since becoming a licensed foster/respice care provider six years ago. Add to that my three Boston kids, my two Maple Grove boys, a good half dozen kids and teens I provided respice care for up in the Cities, the two little ones I babysat every Tuesday and Friday evening through much of junior high, the little girl I went to sit with in the middle of the night when her parents went off to the hospital for her brother's birth, her brother, and handful of other kids through the years—and that number reaches a quiver-full. My own progressive version of the families some conservative Christians model after a description in Psalm 127.

And soon, though I don't know just when yet, the number will become just one. One daughter. No modifiers. No time limits. My cup of blessings gushes forth.

Pre-paid contract for 2,500 gallons of fuel.


**Note:** Please use envelopes in kitchen for coffee/potluck contributions and put in collections plate. No need to separate the money for coffee from potluck.

### **Energy Assistance Program**

Many local families and individuals find it difficult to pay their monthly energy bills. The Energy Assistance Program provides a grant for income-eligible households which can help defray some of these costs. This leaves more of the family resources available for other expenses. We can also assist households in crisis situations with disconnect notices or when they are almost out of heating fuel. Grants are paid directly to the vendor on their behalf.

Households can request an application by calling MVAC at 507-345-6822 or 800-767-7139 or by downloading it from their website [mnavac.org](http://mnavac.org). Applications are currently available, with funds becoming available later in the year, generally mid-late November. The program ends May 31st, 2017. Talk to Lisa for additional information.

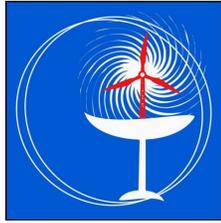


