# A View From the Hill

The three right hands ... plunged in and out of the three distorted stockings, until there was nothing left but the time-hallowed tangerine in the toe. (It was curious how that tradition lingered, even nowadays when children had a good supply of fruit all the year round.)

Jan Struther wrote those lines almost 80 years ago. And all these years later a tangerine or orange *still* nestles in the toe of many distorted stockings on Christmas morning.

Visits to Santa in the mall. A *Messiah* sing-a-long. Oyster stew on Christmas Eve or curry on Christmas Day. Watching *A Charlie Brown Christmas* or *Elf* or *It's a Wonderful Life* or *Christmas Story*. PJs all day or a post-dinner family walk or ice-skating every day during school break. Donating a Toy for Tots. Baking from family recipes, in cross-generational kitchens. Elf-on-a-Shelf.

Traditions linger. Holidays magnify their importance. But traditions start sometime and morph along the way to now. Those citrus-fruit-toed stockings may be time honored. But Elf-on-a-Shelf and *Elf* the movie, not so much.

At the parsonage, in my family, we're anticipating Christmas 2016 with a joyousness not seen since Dad's last Christmas with us 15 years ago. The arrival of a new child/grandchild/niece/cousin has that affect. The arrival of a new child with eleven holiday seasons already under her belt complicates the matter of Christmas traditions. As eager as I am to share my favorite foods, stories, rituals, and songs, just as eager is she to hold on to and share with me her familiar and beloved Christmas traditions.

Marriage, divorce, birth, death, adoption, even the simple passage of one more year changes everything in a family, in ways that are—surprise!—intensified at holiday time. The light of my life (that's what her name means!) and I have the advantage of having the change all out in the open. We have to address our differing experiences and expectations head-on. I can't say it's always easy or fun, but it is a practice I commend to you. As you engage in your family's holiday traditions, take stock with one another. What's each person's favorite tradition and least favorite tradition? Is there one that you'd all be happy to relegate to the realm of days gone by? Is there one that can be transformed from wornout duty into merry-making magic with nothing more than a minor 21st century tweak? What tradition is so precious, so filled with memory and meaning, it needs only more time and more honor paid to it?

Merry Christmas, from my family to you, with all the traditional seasonal cheer we can send and you can receive!

## A letter from Lisa

To recap and update what I wrote last December:

I arrived at Nora Church in August 2009, as your consulting minister. Two years later you installed me as settled minister. As part of our negotiations at that time the Board agreed to allow me to include those first two years in the accrual of years toward a sabbatical. So the time has come, here in our seventh year together, for me to embark on sabbatical.

As of last year I was due six months away from ministerial duties for rest and renewal. I decided for a variety of reasons to split my sabbatical into two chunks. Having been away from Nora (and the parsonage) from for two months early last year, I'm now embarking on the second chunk of my sabbatical.

• The program committee (Christopher Olson, Nita Gilbert, Lee Drogemueller and Karen Farrell) has been busy scheduling a line-up of great speakers to fill the pulpit for four months (there's no service the first Sunday in January). You'll hear Unitarian Universalist ministers as well as ministers and lay-people from other faith traditions.

• If necessary, congregation president Karen Farrell, in consultation with the scheduled speaker, will make the decision regarding weather cancellations.

• Brooke will continue to work five hours a week, generally Tuesdays and Friday.

I'm making arrangements for pastoral care coverage from Unitarian Universalist colleagues. Information on the procedure for accessing pastoral care will be provide in the January newsletter.

I will be 'retreating in place', due to being the mom of a fifth grader, from January 1 through April 30. You may see us around the church grounds or in Hanska or New Ulm, but I won't be conducting church business or participating in church social or worship life. I'll continue the reading and writing projects I began last year, and also spend time at my loom. I anticipate returning to Nora life rested, inspired, and oh so grateful for your generosity in granting me this time away from ministerial duties.
