

#### The Business of Being the Church

At its April meeting (held via Zoom with all members present), the Nora board decided to apply for a Paycheck Protection Program loan from the Small Business Administration, through our regular bank (Alliance Bank) in Hanska. A plan was formulated for devising the 2020-2021 church year budget, and that proposed budget will be sent to the congregation (by USPS) before the end of May. The PPP ran out of money before our loan was processed. Our loan application has been submitted and should additional funds become available, will be considered at that time.

The matter of our Annual Meeting will be on agenda for a board meeting to be held the second week in May. Our by-laws require us to hold an Annual Meeting on the first Sunday in June; they do not specify where such meeting must be held. At this point it seems likely that we convene an annual congregational meeting on June 7, via Zoom, for the sole purpose of entertaining a motion to postpone the business of the annual meeting (reports, budget consideration, etc.) until such time as it is safe to convene an in-person congregational meeting. The number of church members participating in our Zoom gatherings on Sunday noon easily reaches the quorum threshold for congregational meetings, so a meeting with this

one agenda item would allow us to fulfill our by-laws requirement *and* ensure the fullest possible participation in the subsequent, inperson, congregational meeting. More information will be forthcoming in the next newsletter, and every effort will be made to assist members in accessing and learning to use Zoom prior to the meeting date (June 7).

The board did not discuss a date for reopening church, as the state shut-down order has not yet expired. It seems unlikely we will meet again in our church building before late summer. The board will consider starting the 2020-2021 church year earlier than usual, should that be safe.

Thank you to everyone who has recently sent in pledge payments or contributions to the minister's discretionary fund. *Please note* checks should be mailed to the church. Lisa gets the mail every day and makes weekly or bi-weekly deposits at the bank. *For speed and* efficiency of processing, and as a sound fiscal safeguard, do NOT mail checks to Julie **Peck.** The person writing checks on the church account (Julie) should not be the person receiving checks. It also slows everything down and creates extra work for Julie to receive your checks and then mail them to the church for recording and depositing. If you prefer that Lisa not know the details of your financial support to the church, you may hold your pledge payments until Brooke is able to return to working onsite or, better, make arrangements with your financial institution for direct transfer of your pledge to the church account. Julie can help you with those arrangements.

#### Lectio Divina

Make yourself comfortable in front of your screen. You may wish to have a journal and pen at hand. I will welcome you and invite us to breathe together.

Then I will read the day's poem aloud three times. Two minutes of silence will follow each reading for reflection and journaling. The camera will focus on a chalice during the silence.

The three readings of the poem (or scripture passage) are typically designated: listen, ponder, pray (some Unitarian Universalists might say ask).

Second Reading: Ponder why this word/phrase has captured your attention and how it might relate to your life. Can you express the relationship in a single sentence?

Third Reading: Ask what Life/God/the Holy is calling from you or for you, through the word/phrase? How will you live your response to your interaction with this poem?

After the third two minute silent period I will remind you that another video will be posted by 11:00 tomorrow, and then extinguish the chalice.

Due to uncertainty surrounding the safety of large gatherings in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, the annual General Assembly of the Unitarian Universalist Association for June 24 -28, 2020 has been modified to an entirely virtual event. - The "Rainbow Chalice" coalition of LGBTQ+ UU's, teaming with OutFrontMN, regrets the cancellation of this year's PRIDE fests but plans for an even more fabulous 2021, if we can #UUtheVOTE in 2020!
