The committee, (Julie, Lisa, Jeanie, Joy) plan to use the a portion of the \$4,600 donations to purchase initial groceries and whatever items from the attached list that we still need. We will give the family \$500 to spend for their needs, most likely clothing. The remaining money will be set aside to assist in purchasing a car and car insurance.
